### Major Concern 2: Inherit Chinese virtues, strengthen national and national security education, and cultivate positive values and attitudes.

Briefly list the feedback and follow-up actions from the previous school year:

• The majority of students have a positive attitude towards national identity and have correct perceptions and concepts of the national flag, national anthem and achievements, but there is still room for improvement in their understanding of national security. However, most of the students are non-Chinese students with their own home cultures, and their knowledge and understanding of Chinese culture and history still need to be strengthened.

#### **TARGET**

- 1. Through interdisciplinary learning, inherit Chinese virtues and strengthen education on national and citizen security.
- 2. Through diverse activities, enrich the experience of Chinese culture and cultivate good character.
