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### **School Mission**

Li Sing Tai Hang School is an aided primary school, founded by the Tai Hang Residents' Welfare Association in 1958 to provide educational opportunities for local children. Inspired by the spirit of education for all, the school turned into an English-medium primary school in 2003, providing quality education for non-Chinese speaking (NCS) students from different countries. In 2005, the Incorporated Management Committee (IMC) was established, enabling greater autonomy and flexibility in school management.

High importance is attached to providing students with an all-round education. The school motto is "Wisdom, Benevolence and Courage". Fostering students' self-learning skills and nurturing in them a strong interest in the pursuit of knowledge are necessary for developing their wisdom. Furthermore, the school puts emphasis on benevolence and caring for others. The latter is considered to be essential for further advancement of society. The school also believes that with a positive attitude towards life, students can face difficulties with courage, and a promising future is guaranteed.
